

Growth in Georgia Tech undergraduate students' participation in programs abroad in the past five years.


Since 2010, the number of B.S. graduates with an international experience has grown to 1,967.


COC: Number of New IP Participants, by Year



COC: IP Participation as a Percentage of Enrollment, by Major




COC: Participants Abroad Over Time








COC: Participants Abroad by Location, 2014-15*



COC: Participants Abroad by Length, 2014-15


COC: Participants Abroad by Level, 2014-15








COC: Participants Abroad by Race, 2014-15









COC: International Student Citizenship (F & J Visa Holders), 2014-15*
